City Manager jeff Floyd stated that We are here today to do an emergency procurement to get some debris moved off the right of way in the cites and the county. Debris Tech would be the monitoring firm, Del Sole would be a public service company that would handle the picking up part. This is the Right of way only for the City of Alamo, City of Glenwood, and County. The city of Alamo would set a date for our citizens to have the debris out by, so it can be picked up. The Glenwood City Major Jonier had a question, He asked to make sure that he understood, they will not go up into people's yards to remove debris, it will have to be by the road. It will include metal roofing, and all just no personal household garbage.

City Manager Floyd stated that the City of Alamo will be making a resolution for emergency procurement. At some point all this will have to be bided out. The alleys belong to the city so the stuff on the alleys will be picked up by this company also.

City Manager Floyd, Called Attorney Clark and got him on the phone for the rest of the process. Brian Smallwood from Philips and Jordan spoke with us all. All of the debris that comes to the right of way we will pick up we can't go onto public property. We can't pick up on state Hwys. FEMA will reimburse you for any money spent to do this. We have a

monitoring company that will be entering everything we pick up and where we pick up at. We will pick up more than one time. we will pick up until we get all the debris from this storm. We work and do this 365 days a year. It will take us several months to do this. If FEMA approves, they could approve at 100%. We can not go over the fence we can only cut the part that is over the side on the roadway. We will have a dump site set up for us to dump all this material at, it will not be open to the public to dump at. We work for you all, if you all see a site that needs to be worked more let us know. We have already started with the workers coming in and setting up some sites. We don't start, we work sun up sun down until we get done.

Please make sure the debris is not on any utilities and mailboxes when you place it.

Attorney Perry Avery, after reading over all of this what do you think do we need to do one contract or do 3 separate contracts.
